Marker Text:

In 1892, the Rev. Carl J. E. Haterius of Galesburg, Illinois, acquired land at this site with the intention of establishing a community for Swedish settlers. He named the settlement for his wife, Olivia. When the townsite was laid out in 1893, land was set aside for this burial ground in association with the Swedish Lutheran Eden Church. The earliest marked grave is that of Anna Bernardino Wilson, who died in 1902. Swedes and non-Swedes together contributed to the early development of Olivia, and the community cemetery serves as a reminder of their contributions. (1986) Correction: The oldest marked grave in the Olivia Cemetery is that of Christina B. Cavallin, who died in 1897

Notes for MALCOLM LUDWIG CAVALLIN:

The tidal wave of Swedish emigration began in the mid 1840s, when the first organized emigrant groups started to arrive in New York. These farmers destined to Iowa and Illinois were followed during the period up to 1930 by almost 1.3 million countrymen. The Swedes still rank number seven among the European immigrant groups. In proportion to the population of their home countries, only the British Isles and Norway surpassed Sweden in the number of immigrants.

The mass emigration was preceded by the emigration of the pioneers. The individuals, families or groups of families who left Sweden before the American Civil War did not have access to the modern Atlantic liner. They sailed "on top of the cargo" of a bark or a brig from a Swedish harbor, spending months on the sea and finally, more dead than alive, landing in New York. This was the case with the civil servant Gustav Unonius, who emigrated in 1841 and founded the first Swedish settlement in Wisconsin. This held true also for the farmer Peter Cassel and his group, who left in 1845 and landed in New Sweden, Iowa, or for the 1,500 religious dissenters who during 1846-1850 traveled from Central Sweden to their "Land of Canaan," Bishop Hill in Illinois. These sturdy pioneers were people of strength and conviction, willing to fight for their ideals and therefore surrounded by insurmountable obstacles in Sweden. But their conviction and energy became useful tools in America.

MASS EMIGRATION

At the end of the 1860s, Sweden was struck by the last of a series of severe hunger catastrophes. The agriculture which was still only partially modernized had been struggling with difficult times. Now came a series of crop failures. 1867 thus became "the wet year" of rotting grain, 1868 became the "dry year" of burned fields, and 1869 became "the severe year" of epidemics and begging children. Sixty thousand people left Sweden during these three "starvation years". It was the beginning of the mass emigration which, with short intervals, was to continue up to World War I. During the era of mass emigration 1868-1914 more than a million Swedes emigrated, mostly to the U.S. The emigration resumed after the war, but on a more modest scale. It ceased completely during the depression at the end of the 1920s.

THE EMIGRATION MACHINERY

The Swedish mass emigration would not have been possible without the Swedish railroads and the organized passenger traffic over the Atlantic. At this time no Swedish line carried passengers directly from Gothenburg to New York. The Swedes therefore had to use British or German ships. The emigrant route

started with the train ride to the big port of Gothenburg, where the complete passage, such as Gothenburg-Chicago, of the British Wilson Line, which brought the emigrants to Hull in England. A train took them across the country to Liverpool or Glasgow; from there the Inman Line or some other company's ships sailed them to New York. The whole voyage Gothenburg-New York need not take more than three weeks in 1870.

NEW YORK, THE GATEWAY TO AMERICA

New York met the newcomers with a forest of masts. The impression created by the big city must have been overwhelming for the children of the soil. Strange tongues and the busy activities of the "runners" were nerve-racking and bewildering. Many of the young girls had now reached their goal - work in an American household - but for most the seaport was only one step along the way, a place to change means of transportation for the journey inland.

THE JOURNEY THROUGH AMERICA

For most immigrants New York was just the half-way point. In the early days the journey continued by paddle steamer up the Hudson River to Albany. Before the railroads were built the Erie Canal, completed in 1825, served as the link between the Hudson River and the Great Lakes. From Buffalo the emigrants were taken by paddle steamer over the Lakes to Chicago, Milwaukee or Duluth. The last part of the 1-3 month long journey was spent on horse carts or walking through the bush. This itinerary was, of course, completely changed by the railroads, which from the 1850s brought the emigrants straight to Chicago. Modern communications made the overland route to the homestead region relatively simple from the beginning of the Swedish mass emigration.

THE HOMESTEADERS

President Lincoln's Homestead Act of 1862, the political stabilization after 1865, and the enormously expanding industries of the North represented three important drawing factors on Swedish emigration to the U.S. The generous offer of the Homestead Act became a powerful magnet on land-hungry farm people. This also destined them to the so-called Homestead Triangle, especially to Minnesota, which became the Swede State of America. This was in accordance with the politics of Minnesota, where in 1867 a state immigration office was established. The Swedish Civil War colonel Hans Mattson became its first director. The result of the Swedish land-hunger was that the area of Swedish-owned farmland in America of 1920 corresponded to 2/3 of all arable land in Sweden. In some counties, such as Chicago, Isanti and Kanabec in Minnesota, the land became almost totally owned by Swedes. A string of Swedish settlements also grew up around the new railroads. The possibility of combining farmwork with jobs for the railroad or a lumber company was important for the penniless Swedes. Most of the unmarried men worked as lumberjacks or on the railroads. The railroad king James Hill is quoted: "Give me snuff, whiskey and Swedes, and I will build a railroad to hell."

THE HOMES IN THE NEW WORLD

The everyday reality of the pioneer's life often replaced the glitter of the dream. But they did not give up. The first home was a cabin as simple and primitive as a poor "torpstuga" in Smaland, Sweden, but built on Minnesota's fertile soil. Clearing the ground of stones was replaced by the rooting out of stumps - it is hard to say which task was the more wearisome! The prairie was so different from the landscapes of Sweden that the emigrants hesitated to settle there. Since time immemorial the Swede has used wood as his principal material for the construction of tools, furniture, and buildings, and for fuel. The great unforested plains required a new way of living. But these difficulties were also overcome. The problems of work and everyday life were solved with great ingenuity.

MOST SWEDES STAYED IN THE CITIES

The popular picture of the Swedish immigrant is the hardworking farmer, something like Vilhelm Moberg's description in his emigrant novels. But reality looked otherwise. In 1910 no less than 61% of 665,000 Swedish-born Americans lived in cities. This was a much higher level of urbanization than in Sweden. It looks as if the Swedes combined the move to another country with the step from farm to town. To many this development had been prepared by the experience of one of Sweden's cities right before emigration. The wave of emigration passed through expanding cities like Chicago and Minneapolis. The labor market of the big city had more and better offers to cash-less immigrants than the farm regions. This was especially true for the unmarried women who had enough of their old lives as milkmaids. Therefore the industries of the cities absorbed more and more Swedish immigrants.

Chicago became the center of the urbanization process. The population figures for Gothenburg, Sweden's second largest city, were at the turn of the century surpassed by Chicago's Swedish population, which was then close to 150,000 of first and second generation. Since 1870 Chicago had its own Swede Town with a

"Swedish Snuff Street" as its main vein. The Swedish Chicagoans became prominent within all walks of life. They were especially important within the building industry, a fact which is reflected in the saying that "the Swedes built Chicago."

SWEDISH-AMERICA

The emigrants from Sweden spoke their own language and were influenced by traditions quite different from the ones prevailing in the "adopted land." From the 1870s many were living in densely populated settlements which Chicago and Minnesota had melted together into vast Swedish-dominated areas. They became the cradles of Swedish-American culture with characteristics different from both America and Sweden. In the midst of such an enclave it was easy to believe that Swedish language and traditions would remain in the U.S.A. At that time the Swedes had long had their own churches, clubs, schools and newspapers. It was possible to live and die in Chicago or Minnesota without speaking anything but Swedish. The first Swedish church congregations were founded in the 1850s in Illinois. The Lutherans became the predominant group and in 1860 they had founded the Augustana Synod. When this church group in 1962 was merged with other Lutheran synods, it comprised 1,269 congregations with close to 630,000 baptized members. The first Swedish-language newspaper, *HEMLANDET*, was issued in Galesburg, Ill., in 1855. It attracted 1,500 followers, most of them published before World War I. No one has yet been able to measure the volume of literature published in "Swedish-America." The first Swedish social clubs were started in New York in 1836 and in Chicago in 1857. These trail blazers for Swedish-American community life were followed by thousands of clubs and fraternal orders all over the country. The churches and societies started their own schools, hospitals, and old-age homes. Such activities kept the Swedish-Americans together around an ethnocentric core.

Although ethnocentric activities absorbed quite a lot of energy, the main field of the Swedish activities was America. The overwhelming majority of Swedish immigrants had to start from the bottom level of society. Even skilled artisans met with severe problems when they did not speak the language. But the bulk of immigrants had very little professional experience. They had been expelled from the rural society in Sweden. In Chicago the men got jobs as underpaid laborers, and the girls became maids in "American families" if they were not hired as seamstresses in the "sweat shops". Some of them could not stand the hardships. They returned to Sweden, or sank down in the big city's underworld.

THE SWEDISH HERITAGE IN AMERICA

The vast majority, however, overcame the difficulties and created a position in America. Some made careers as businessmen, professional men, artists or politicians. Their achievements are also present in America today. They can be sensed behind great companies or inventions. This is not the place to give a catalog of outstanding Swedes in America. A sampling of them is in the exhibition, men like Carl Sandburg, the Illinois poet, Charles Lindbergh, the first man to fly across the Atlantic, Eric Wickman, the organizer of the Greyhound Company or Wendell Anderson, the contemporary representative of a long series of Swedish governors in Minnesota. Other names could be added, such as Glenn Seaburg, the Nobel Prize winner, or John Ericson, the inventor of the propeller and the constructor of America's first battleship the "MONITOR" of the Civil War.

It is hard to imagine modern America without the influence of the Swedish immigrants, just as modern Sweden would have been different without impulses and innovations from America. This is our common heritage of the fantastic immigration era, a heritage which forever links our two countries together. The emigration divided the Swedish people into two branches, one in Sweden and one in America. About one fifth of all Swedes lived in America at the beginning of this century. It is an estimate that there are as many Americans of Swedish descent today as there are inhabitants in Sweden, or a little more than eight million. This gives us reason to celebrate the American Bicentennial also in Sweden.

THE HOUSE OF EMIGRANTS

In 1966 an Emigrant Institute was started in Sweden. Its purpose is to collect and register all kinds of source material dealing with the immigration period. The Emigrant Institute is also active in the U.S.A. where church records and other sources of Swedish background are systematically being microfilmed. In Smaland, the heartland of Swedish emigration history, a House of Emigrants has been built, where exhibitions, archives and a library serve anyone interested in Swedish emigration history. This unique institution has up until now received a quarter of a million visitors. Thousands of them have been Americans searching for their ethnic roots. Many have been helped to re-establish connections with the Swedish branch of their family. The House of Emigrants is willing to do its best to help others, even if they cannot come and see us. OLIVIA, TEXAS. Olivia is near the junction of State highways 172 and 159, fourteen miles east of Port Lavaca in eastern Calhoun County. It is on a peninsula that is bound on the west by Kellers Bay, on the south by Matagorda Bay, and on the east by Carancahua Bay. William Arnold was the original grantee of the land on which Olivia is now situated. During the later 1800s the Clements and Mitchell families grazed cattle on the peninsula. Olivia was established in 1892 by a Swedish Lutheran colony led by C. J. E. Haterious of Galesburg, Illinois; he bought 13,565 acres from J. D. Mitchell. Haterious named the settlement after Olivia, his wife. Among the first settlers were the families of A. G. Bergstrom, M. L. Cavallin, John Lind, Nels Larson, Charles Johnson, Pete Swenson, Gust Swenson, Olaf Martinson, Eben Williams, Bengt Fyher, and J. F. Skogberg. The new residents brought in a small cotton crop in 1893, but they had to travel to Edna in Jackson County to have it ginned. The next year local farmers purchased a small plantation gin, which they set up on Carancahua Bay, just east of Olivia. In 1896 Olivia had a general store and semiweekly mail. Charles Erickson established a mail and freight service to Olivia in 1903. In 1904 a community school had one teacher and forty-four students. The town had 200 residents in 1914. By 1927, however, its population had dropped to fifty. In 1932 the completion of the Hug-the-Coast Highway linked Olivia with towns in Jackson County. Electricity was available to Olivia residents by 1934, and that year local planters formed the Olivia Cotton Growers Cooperative Marketing Association to gin cotton for its members. In 1939 four teachers instructed seventy-five students through the ninth grade, but by 1955 the school had been absorbed into the county school district. The town grew throughout the 1960s and reported a population of 200 in 1972. In 1990 its population was listed at 215.

The book is in poor condition (disintegrating and deteriorating from age) and difficult to read. Mr. Sundqvist was kind enough to give us his time to translate this piece. The book is the original, with no copy that we are aware of; and, to the best of our knowledge, this is the first time it has been viewed outside the Swedish M. E. Church that was finally closed down in Wayne, Republic County, Kansas. Mr. Sundqvist has asked me to correct any English that was not properly done. Quite frankly, I consider it an excellent job and chose to leave it as he translated it. The only correction I have made is the html coding and page layout so that the translation may be read on the Internet.

Without the help of Mr. Sundqvist, this work could not have been accomplished and there is no amount of THANK YOUs that will ever repay his generosity in helping not only me to discover information about my family, but also other families to discover their genealogy.

Many of these people emigrated from Bollnas, Alfta, and Enviken in Sweden. Many went to Bishop Hills, IL and then completed their destination to Clay Center, Clay County, Kansas and on to Wayne Village, Republic County, Kansas. They helped to build Wayne Village. After the loss of the railroad, Wayne began to die and in 1999, there are possibly 4 or 5 families still living there. However, that history is rich with the integrity and industrious personality of the Swedish emigrants who developed the area. This is but one of the almost lost records of them being there.

Dear Jackie: So good to hear from you! First, one of my sisters is married to a George (Sonny) Chiles but I don't know anything about the Chiles family other than Sonny and his immediate family.

I don't know exactly where you and your husband fit into the Cavallin family but perhaps you are in the family of my Uncle *John Cavallin. I'll tell you what I know.

Malcolm Ludwig Cavallin (my Grandfather) was born in Skeda parish, Sweden, May 04, 1851. He came to the U.S. August 08, 1869. His first place of residence was St. Joe, Michigan, where his first occupation was working on the first railroad built in that city. He died January, 1933, in Olivia, Texas.

Christina Beata Larson, born in 1852 in Hjo in Vastergotland, Sweden. As a young girl she came to U.S. with her family and they settled in Iowa. Don't have their date of entry into the U.S. Her father's name was Carl Larson. Christina died in 1897 in Olivia, Texas. Her grave was the first one in the Olivia cemetery.

Malcolm and Christina were married April 27, 1876, at the home of the bride in Lucas County Iowa by Rev. Frokman, Lutheran Minister.

(Note: A cousin that has traveled to Sweden reports that the Swedish spelling for Malcolm is Malcom and that of Larson is Larsson. The names were Americanized.)

The children of Malcolm and Christina were: Ellen Catherina (2/02/1877 - 2/19/1948); Gustav Adolph (6/22/1879 - 12/31/1942); *Carl John (1/31/1881 - 7/08/1934); Oscar Frederick (12/03/1882 - 1/1/1948); Mabel Magnolia (9/22/1884 - 2/28/1958); Malcolm Magnus (1/22/1889 - 3/10/1889); Guy Lincoln (2/23/1890 - 11/-3/1955); Malcolm Owen, my Father, (2/01/1892 - 4/20/1977).

I have information on the Malcolm & Christina Cavallin family between the time they were married and how and when they came to Texas, if you are interested.

I have a second cousin that has traveled to Sweden at least twice to find information on the Cavallin and Larson (Christina's family) families. She is Becky Meriwether and the last address I had was 1626 Park Dr., Raleigh, NC 27605. She is the great- granddaughter to John and Annie Cavallin. The last time I talked to her (probably 4 years ago) she had pretty much finished her research on the Cavallin and Larson (Christina's family) families. She was beginning her research on Annie's family. She planned to eventually publish a book on the families once she completed her research on Aunt Annie.

I will appreciate any information you may have on the Cavallin family.

Carl John Cavallin 1881 - 1934 and Annie M. Cavallin 1183 - 1976. The dates for Annie may or may not be correct. A couple of the Cavallin family grave stones list different dates from those in Malcolm L. and Christina's Family Bible. Carl John's dates are the same as in the Bible. You notice Annie's middle initial is M on the grave marker.

I have a copy of Shifting Sands of Calhoun County and Port Lavaca, Texas, 1840 - 1990. I don't remember seeing Annie's name in either of these books.

Yes, please send me Becky Meriwether's current address, e-mail also if you receive it. I would love to get back in touch with her. I'm sure you will be able to obtain info on Annie from Becky.

Your mention of the Petersen name. Is it Petersen or Peterson? The sen is usually Danish spelling. We Cavallins are related to a bunch of Peterson people. I didn't answer your question re Cavallins in Minnesota because I don't know anything about them. The reason I'm so anxious to get back in touch with Becky is because she had so much information on Malcolm

L. and Christina. She had names of their parents, his brothers, etc. I only got to visit with her a short while and I was trying to correct the information I had on Malcolm L.'s parents and brothers. When she said she planned to put it all in a book and publish it, I didn't bother to finish correcting. Becky's information is correct because she obtained it from records in Sweden and other reliable sources. I was very disappointed to learn that the names I had for Malcolm L.'s brothers were not correct so I haven't passed them on to anyone else.

I would like any pictures you may have. I haven't pictures at this time but will try to get a copy of one in particular that has Malcolm L. in it along with some of us grandchildren. My sister, Sue and her husband "Sonny" Chiles, bought Dad and Mom's home from our estate. We all agreed that Dad & Mom's family pictures should be left with the house so all of us could have access to them. The house is here in Palacios but a few years ago when a hurricane was headed this way, they took all the pictures to their Sugar Land home for safe keeping.

I have a copy of Malcolm L.'s cattle brand that was published in a book and I also have a song that Katheryn Cavallin Townsend wrote in 1985 and has a copyright but she shared it with other family members so I know she doesn't mind it being shared with other family. The song title is Cavallin. I don't have a scanner but I will make copies and mail them to you.

Speaking of misinformation, earlier this afternoon I sent Katheryn's name in connection with Oscar F. Cavallin and I spelled it wrong. Until I dug out the song I had forgotten the correct spelling. Sorry about that. Katheryn was an accomplished musician and song writer. She taught school for many years and received many honors, local and state. She passed away in 1989 at age 71.

Church that was finally closed down in Wayne, Republic County, Kansas. Mr. Sundqvist has asked me to correct any English that was not properly done. Quite frankly, I consider it an excellent job and chose to leave it as he translated it. The only correction I have made is the html coding and page layout so that the translation may be read on the Internet.

Without the help of Mr. Sundqvist, this work could not have been accomplished and there is no amount of THANK YOUs that will ever repay his generosity in helping not only me to discover information about my famly, but also other families to discover their genealogy.

Many of these people emigrated from Bollnas, Alfta, and Enviken in Sweden. Many went to Bishop Hills, IL and then completed their destination to Clay Center, Clay County, Kansas and on to Wayne Village, Republic County, Kansas. They helped to build Wayne Village. After the loss of the railroad, Wayne begin to die and in 1999, there are possibly 4 or 5 families still living there. However, that history is rich with the integrity and industrious personality of the Swedish emigrants who developed the area. This is but one of the almost lost records of them being there.

August and Joseph finally relented and they decreed that Chester couldn't take young Fred along. Chester defied them and took Fred along. On the way back they were stopped at a service station or garage when an air raid siren went off and they had to seek cover (there were never any attacks on continental soil during WWII so it was just a drill).

The California Death Index shows Josephine M Larson who was born 4/21/1877 and died 7/23/1942 in San Diego County. It lists her father's last name as Holden and mother's as Olson but everything fits except the order of the names and her father's last name. It may very well be that her father realized that Hoaglund is still fairly Swedish sounding and changed his name to Holden (or it could be a typo).

Writings from Grandpa Larson

(I am typing this from a photocopy of Grandpa Larson's handwriting. Some of the handwriting is not clear and I have hesitate to make any assumptions by "correcting" or changing any spelling or wording, not wanting to change or presume to have knowledge of the exact interpretation. Karen Peterson)

In the year of 1868 some 5 or 6 families landed in Chariton, Iowa from Sweden in South Central part of the state, that being the end of the C.B.Q (?) Railroad at that time in the month of Oct. The(y) had sent a

man ahead the previous spring to have a place ready for them to camp in and to their surprise they found only the floor laid to a shack. However some boards were gotten and they got busy to get walls and roof over it and rain beginning as it was and quite chilly. The(y) were practically all wet and then _____ when they all got in there it was just like packed sardines than a bunk house. Among these families my parents and 7 brothers and sisters 3 girls 4 boys, one sister had died at 2 years of age. My youngest sister was two yrs at that time. My father went 2 or 3 miles to get some milk at an English speaking family not knowing a word of english somehow making his wants known. While waiting for the same he fainted. The only time remembered of him fainting. And then the next thing to try and find some place where they could prepare a place to live in as winter was near at hand. This was 9 miles from railroad and 5 miles from railroad the opposite there was a Swede man living that had learned a little of the language. 3 of the men went to hunt him and the(y) located some land 5 miles from R.R. and built a small house all the families had children and the 3 families lived there together around one stove for over two years . After two years I arrived to increase the number however when I was 6 months old my father had succeeded to get a house of our own. While my parents did not have any material wealth they had put their trust in the Lord and that _____ than earthly riches the children can very little understand what it is to them to have Christian parents thank God for all of them during my childhood and even in my youth I never had courage to go again(st) my parents will in outward appearance was always considered to be respectable, but God sees the _____ and that needed to be made clean would say there are secret sins I believe worse to overcome than gross outward sins. Thank God he calls and calls again and at 18 years of age I could not withstand his calling any longer so surrendered to him. My mother asked me one evening if I did not want her to pray with me and we felt _____. I did not get peace then but could not sleep before light came in I prayed that I would get some sign of that my sins were forgiven all answered prayers, my grace is sufficient for that _____ on praying no other answer the third time I got that answer. My burden rolled off and I was a new creation in Christ Jesus. Oh how I rejoiced, but the Devil does not like that. He starts was against the soul and many a time I have laid slain but if we confess our sins to him he is just and faithful to forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. O' if we always would go to God's word and hearken to it in time of temptation how much anguish and guilt we would spare us but thanks be to God he does not leave us but he follows us with his loving mercy. At 23 years of age I was entered into marriage to Hannah Matilda Englund. We took our abode on my father's farm and resided there 13 years during this time we was blessed with 8 children. In 1906 we left my childhood home and moved to Canada and made our home in a new settled district, stuck up a tent to live in, started to work and prepare a home. Often the timber with _____ and and saw to cut logs to build with the R.R. was 25 miles away and no good roads and not much money to buy timber for the month of August we left the tent and moved in our first house.

Well, as you can tell the writing is pretty broken up, but I am amazed at how well this man expresses himself. You can certainly tell that he was a very Christian and kind man, much like my father-in-law, Arvid Verner Peterson was.

I'll send more as I get the time to type.

"In 1926, after many years of roaming from place to place, John & Annie Cavallin and children decided to settle on a place of their own. They purchased a tract of 640 acres (in a very rundown condition at the time) in the rural community of Deutschburg. With a wiliness to make a home for themselves, they repaired and cleaned the place to make it habitable. In the following years, with the help of the children, John and Annie worked hard and made a fairly good crop, considering the new land and many difficulties to over come.

On July 8, 1934, sorrow fell over the family when John, the leader, died. John was an honorable man, a good supporter of his family, and, in community service, he held the position of trustee of the school."

I can remember Uncle John's death. In those days every so often some one would have a dance in their home. The whole family would go and while the parents danced and visited the children played outside. It was at one of these dances that I attended with my family, that Uncle John suffered a heart attack. I don't know if he died instantly or if it was some hours later.

Floyd Cavallin is certain his grandmother was Annie Larson Cavallin. For now, I will leave them under Annie until another wife is found.

There are several birth records of a John Calvin Cavallin and a Mary Louise Naquin having children in Jackson, Harris and Matagorda Counties in Texas. Could this be another child of our John Cavallin or perhaps a newpew or another marriage for our John Cavallin?

Dear Jackie:

In my "stuff" I have notes taken from grave markers in the Olivia cemetery. Among them are: Carl John Cavallin 1881 - 1934 and Annie M. Cavallin 1183 - 1976. The dates for Annie may or may not be correct. A couple of the Cavallin family grave stones list different dates from those in Malcolm L. and Christina's Family Bible. Carl John's dates are the same as in the Bible. You notice Annie's middle initial is M on the grave marker.

Your mention of the Petersen name. Is it Petersen or Peterson? The sen is usually Danish spelling. We Cavallins are related to a bunch of Peterson people. Malcolm L and Christian's 2 daughters, Ellen Catherine and Mabel Magnolia, married brothers. Ellen married Charlie Emil Peterson (2/12/1868 - ?/1951). Mabel married Otto Peterson (1881 - ?). I will have more info on Otto later this month, hopefully. There are a lot of Petersons kin to us because Aunt Ellen and Uncle Charlie had 9 children and they all had children, a lot of them still living in the Olivia and Port Lavaca area. Aunt Mabel and Uncle Otto only had 2 boys. Uncle Charlie and Uncle Otto were both born in Sweden.

I have never heard that Malcolm L. was ever in California, however, I have heard that a branch of his family was there. Nothing concrete, just people talking.

Hi Jackie: In the file you sent I found most all of my family's names but the information was a little garbled and/or incomplete. So here is the straight scoop!

Malcolm Owen Cavallin (2/1/1892 - 4/20/1977), (youngest child of Malcolm Ludwig Cavallin and Christina Beata Larson Cavallin), born in Wayne, Kansas Republic, and traveled with his family by covered wagon to Olivia, Texas, as an infant. Malcolm Owen served in WW1 although some of the printed information on Olivia does not include his name. I have his original discharge. As a young man Malcolm Owen was a cowboy and worked on several ranches including the famous Matador Land & Cattle Company Ranch. At the age of 32 he married Aprilla Brock Powell on 10/18/1924, in Palacios, Texas. She was a widow with 3 living children.

Aprilla Brock (10/10/1892 - 7/25/1976), child of Frank Harrison Brock and Basha Della Adkins Brock, was born in Hayes County, Texas. Aprilla married Nathan Tony Powell (1880 - 1923) on 12/10/1908. Aprilla Brock Powell had 4 children by Nathan Tony Powell. They were: Lois Louise Powell (9/05/09 - 7/14/1931), Mary Dee Powell (? - 1911), Dorothy Mae Powell (9/25/1916 - living), Luther Van Powell (9/28/1920 - 5/05/1989).

4 children were born to Malcolm Owen Cavallin and Aprilla Brock Powell Cavallin, they are: Mildred (Mickey) Aprilla (11/21/1925-living), Thelma Jean (12/1927 - 5/1929), twins: Beulah Sue and Blanche Lou (10/04/1932 -living.)

Although Malcolm Owen did not officially adopt the Powell children he loved and treated them as though they were his biological children.

The McIlroy in your file I'm sure is Teri Lynn Markwardt McIlroy, daughter of Roy Harold Markwardt and Blanche Lou Cavallin Markwardt. The name Mary Dee Cavallin is in error, she was Mary Dee Powell, daughter of Aprilla Brock Powell Cavallin and her first husband, Nathan Tony Powell.

Lee, as he preferred to be called, did not get along with his father. When Lee was 18 he swore at a horse after it kicked him. His father, John Smith Webb, overhearing this picked up a 2"x 4" (piece of lumber) threatened to teach Lee not to swear. John came at Lee with the lumber but (assumedly because Lee was larger than him) stopped before actually striking Lee. Lee told him, "If you do that again, I'll kill you!" Soon after this incident Lee left home.

Lee played semi-pro baseball as a catcher. As an exhibition game in Central Butte, Saskatchewan, Canada (think Lee was on the home team) was about to start Lee found himself without his catcher's mask. He decided to catch the first batter without the mask. Unfortunately, the first pitch was tipped and caromed up to hit his right eye.

Lee also played semi-pro hockey. While playing hockey he took a puck to the same right eye. As a result of the two injuries the lens in Lee's right eye was heavily damaged leaving him functionally blind in that

right eye. The eye was discolored and could only make out shapes. In the 1960's it was discovered that the vision in his right eye could be repaired but by this time the "lazy eye" in the right eye was so ingrained that Lee determined it would not be worth the hassle to have his vision restored.

Lee worked at many jobs during his lifetime. In 1923 he worked at a Ford plant in Detroit, Michigan where his job was to drill holes in the carrier bearing pillow block for grease zerks. During his time in Detroit he had a girlfriend. One day he happened upon his girlfriend and her mother on the street and had to turn and spit some chewing tobacco before he could greet them. He was so ashamed that he determined right there to discontinue chewing tobacco.

Lee next moved to San Bernardino, San Bernardino County, CA where he worked as an elevator operator. He developed a relationship with a girl named Lorna and proposed to her. We do not know what became of her or the relationship, but even after he had married Mable Larson, Lee was concerned that Lorna would sue him for breaching their marriage agreement.

After San Bernardino, Lee moved to the Hollister/San Juan Batista area where he worked as a day laborer in the fields. Before 1929 he moved to Merced, Merced County, CA where he worked as a foreman at a Cal-Pac peach packing plant. While living in Merced, he met Mable Larson when visiting his sister Frances Webb in the hospital and again found her massaging his hands when he awoke from anesthesia after having his appendix removed.

Lee and Mable started dating but after the third date Mable informed Lee that she could not continue to date him because she could not marry a man that was not a Seventh-day Adventist. Lee went to the local SDA pastor to ask why Mable was so sweet and he decided to take Bible studies. Lee and Mable were married on Lee's 30th birthday.

After their marriage, Lee and Mable invested all of their money into chickens and started farming chickens. After Jack was born, they hit hard times and lost their entire operation and money. They were forced to move in with Mable's mother in Chowchilla. During the drive to Chowchilla, their suitcase with all of the baby clothes for Jack fell off of the car and was lost leaving them both penniless and with no clothing or diapers for their child.

Lee suffered his first major heart attack in 1947 and was forced to severely curtail his activity. In August of 1955 he had his second heart attack and had to completely discontinue active labor.

Did Humans Descend From 33 Daughters of Eve?

'Your Genes Have Been Through a Fantastic Journey,' Geneticist Says

HAY-ON-WYE, Wales - We are all descended from the 33 daughters of Eve. Just take a swab from your cheek and you can find which one is your original ancestor.

That is the view of Professor Bryan Sykes, one of the world's top geneticists who has spent the last decade mapping out where we come from.

"Your genes have been through a fantastic journey," he told Britain's leading literary festival on Tuesday in the Welsh border town of Hay-on-Wye where he laid out a fascinating DNA pathway to the past.

Now, after opening such a fascinating Pandora's Box, he has found that thousands of people around the world, from the United States to South Africa, are consumed with curiosity and want to find out who their original "clan mother" is.

"This shows how closely connected we all are," he said

The Oxford University professor first started taking DNA from archaeological bones and then in 1994 was called in to examine the frozen remains of a 5,000-year-old man trapped in glacial ice in Northern Italy.

This led him to research how a gene passed undiluted from generation to generation through the maternal line and helped him to track down our own genetic ancestors.

"If you look at the mitochondrial gene, it is DNA which is just inherited from your mother. It is found in eggs not sperm," he explained in an interview with Reuters.

After taking several thousand DNA samples, the clan mothers in Europe were narrowed down to "The Seven Daughters of Eve," the title of his new book chronicling his DNA detective work.

"To bring these women alive I gave them names and worked out where they lived and when. They range from Ursula in Greece 45,000 years ago to Jasmine 10,000 years ago in Syria -- she came from the Middle East along with the farmers," he said.

"There are roughly 33 equivalent clusters if you take the whole world. Eventually it all comes down to Mitochondrial Eve in Africa 200,000 years ago," he added.

Sykes said "Thousand of people have asked to have a DNA test to find out who they are descended from."

So oxfordancestors.com was set up on the Internet.

You send off 150 pounds, receive a swab kit and then send it back for analysis that will reveal your origins.

"The majority came from the United States. I think the reason for the interest is rediscovering the fact we have a history and the genes are not just something you are given like a National Insurance Number," Sykes said.

"Your genes are a very, very precious gift and you should be proud of them," he concluded.
