

Six Youths Admit 26 Theft Charges

Six teen-age youths were given sentences ranging from three months to one year when they pleaded guilty in Bowness police court Friday to 26 charges of theft and attempted theft of gasoline from cars and trucks.

Gepko Kor, Montgomery trucker, told Magistrate J. J. Weaver he waited six nights to catch culprits who had siphoned 265 gallons of gasoline from his trucks since last October.

He said he smashed in the window of a car in which they were riding when he found them siphoning gasoline from one of his vehicles. He said when he forced them from their auto one

of the youths acted tough so he struck him.

Allan Stanley Russell, 19, was given consecutive two-month terms on six theft charges and a concurrent six-month sentence for attempted theft.

Ronald Thomas Cottrel, 17, and Lyle Henry Dupuis, 16, were given similar sentences.

Ronald Charles Forster, 17, drew consecutive two-month sentences on charges of theft and attempted theft.

Robert Harold Fox, 16, and Gerald Evens, 16, were given consecutive one month terms on three theft counts.

Magistrate Weaver recommended that Forster, Fox and Evens serve their sentences in Bowden Institute.
