Young Scientists At Work

Ceres High School will sponsor its fourth annual science symposium tonight and tomorrow, and these three CHS students are looking forward to it with more personal concern than the other 150 Northern California students who will participate.

Each will present a paper on a different subject. From left, Harley Baker will offer details on "Holography;" Alan Fujii, "The Frog and Its Spleen"; and

The theme of "High School Science Research" will be used in the symposium, which will open its sessions at 8:30 o'clock tonight and will continue through tomorrow.

Highlights will be the first public showing of new scientific laser (coherent light) equipment for high school laboratory, research and industrial use and closed circuit television coverage of the sessions.

About 150 students from 30 high schools in Northern California and college instructors are expected to attend. The symposium started four years ago on a county level and has been expanded to include the northern area of the state, according to Jack Davison, science department chairman and director of the project. The sessions are sponsored jointly by the Ceres science department and the California Science Teachers Association.
