WAHOO—George B. Sherwood, 62, and his wife, Opal Sherwood, 58, of Wahoo both died of natural causes Monday.

Mr. Sherwood died of cancer at Saunders County Hospital at Wahoo. Mrs. Sherwood died of heart disease at a Lincoln hospital.

Mr. Sherwood was born April 9, 1918, at Beaver Crossing. He and Mrs. Sherwood lived at Wahoo since 1948.
